WINSTONE AGGREGATES SAFETY AWARD



The Winstone Aggregates Health and Safety Award is awarded to the quarry operation judged to have **implemented a meaningful improvement or initiative resulting in a measurable shift in the workforce engagement** and improved health and safety outcomes.

Sponsored by Winstone Aggregates, this trophy recognises that there has been a shift in mindset at the operation when it comes to health and safety and is a very prestigious award.

Nominations for this award can be made by any branch of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) or any quarry operation and must be supported in detail on the reasons for the nomination.

This most coveted trophy is presented through the IOQ NZ (Inc.) by Winstone Aggregates and is in the form of a large mounted crystal.

WORKSAFE CHIEF INSPECTOR SAFETY LEADERSHIP AWARD

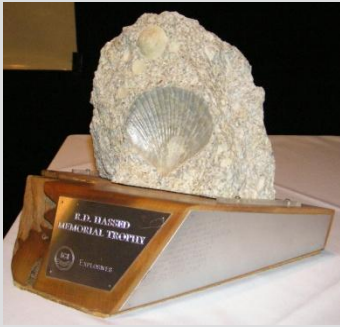


The WorkSafe Chief Inspector Safety Leadership Award **recognises a Company demonstrating strong leadership, continuous improvement, and commitment to health and safety** within the extractives and support sectors.

The award is aimed at a Company rather than an individual site and is judged by Inspectors led by the Chief Inspector Extractives.

Nominees must be an IOQ NZ (Inc.) or AQA member.

R D HASSELD AWARD



This trophy is awarded to an IOQ NZ (Inc.) member **who has made the most significant contribution to their Branch during the current year**. Nominations for this award can be made by any member of the Institute or any group committee.

This trophy remains the property of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation at the QuarryNZ Annual Conference held in July each year.

The trophy is a piece of limestone containing a scallop shell fossil from Pakipaki Quarry in Hawkes Bay, and is mounted on a wooden base.

LYN JORDAN MEMORIAL TROPHY



This trophy is awarded to an IOQ NZ (Inc.) member, or members, for **the "Best Technical Paper" given at an Institute Branch Meeting or the QuarryNZ Annual Conference** over the past 12 months.

The award is in memory of the late Lyn Jordan who was an early member of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) and is in the form of a vintage exploder donated by the Explosives Division of ICI NZ Ltd (now Orica). The trophy remains the property of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation.

TERRACAT TRAVEL AWARD **(not available 2026)**



The TerraCat Award is a \$3,500 travel grant, towards the cost of travel within New Zealand or Australia for **the operator who has shown exceptional dedication and commitment to the quarrying industry**.

This award is given to the IOQ NZ (Inc.) member who has been employed in the quarry industry for at least 2 years.

TURNCO-ASTEC ACHIEVEMENT AWARD



This award recognises an achievement by an IOQ NZ (Inc.) member **or team who have been responsible for a significant operational, maintenance, or problem-solving achievement within the extractives industry.**

The award offers the opportunity to reward an achiever or team, who may not necessarily be conspicuous within the industry.

KOMATSU LEADERSHIP AWARD



This award is presented to an IOQ NZ (Inc.) member who has **achieved 10 or more years membership, holds a management position within the quarrying industry and has demonstrated outstanding leadership and contribution** to the Institute and industry over the preceding two years.

This prestigious award is presented every two years and includes an overseas trip (TBC).

IAN RODGER MEMORIAL TROPHY (NEW)



The Ian Rodger Memorial Trophy **recognises a supplier organisation or industry partner who has demonstrated outstanding and ongoing support to the New Zealand quarrying industry and the Institute of Quarrying New Zealand (IOQ NZ (Inc.))**, contributing to the strength, professionalism, and sustainability of the sector.

The award acknowledges those whose commitment, collaboration and contribution have helped strengthen the Institute, support industry development, and enable professional growth across the sector.

B.R. WEBSTER FAMILY EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP



The Scholarship **is awarded to individuals who are studying towards a nationally recognised qualification in order to advance their management capability within the quarrying sector.** The scholarship includes all course fees, travel, accommodation and incidental expenses up to \$3,000 per annum, up to a maximum of three years.

Scholarship recipients must be an IOQ NZ (Inc.) member for a minimum of 12 months prior to applying for the scholarship.

A J & R J LOADER SPONSORS SHIELD



This award in the form of a shield donated by Andy & Raewyn Loader is for **the best sponsor's display judged annually at the QuarryNZ Conference.** The trophy remains the property of the IOQ NZ (Inc.) and is held by the current recipient for the twelve months following its presentation.

ADDITIONAL AWARDS & CITATIONS



The INSTITUTE OF QUARRYING NZ AWARD is very much the 'members award' and awarded by IOQ NZ (Inc.) to **formally recognise both a long-serving member who is held in high regard because of a long period of outstanding service to the Institute, and/or a retiring President at the end of his tenure on the Executive Council.** This Award is, above all, a measure of the esteem in which the nominee is held by his colleagues, and is made in the true spirit of Institute fellowship.

A CITATION is similar to the IOQNZ (Inc.) Award except that it formally recognises a long-serving member who has not held a position on the Executive Committee.

HONORARY FELLOWS are elected by the NZ Executive Committee and will be a person who has rendered such service to the Institute or the industry generally as warrants honorary fellowship and who has:

- i) made a significant contribution to the Institute or to the industry, or
- ii) holds a position in the Institute or the Industry which merits such recognition.

The CAERNARFON AWARD is presented annually for the **best paper given at an Institute conference, seminar, meeting etc anywhere in the world which is adjudged to have contributed the most to the advancement of some aspect of the industry - either technical, environmental or strategic etc.** Originally, the Caernarfon Award was endowed by the North Wales branch and it is named after the town where the very first Institute meeting took place in 1917. The award has been made by Council in the UK in the past, but in 1998, responsibility for the adjudication was assumed by the International Presidents' Committee.
